Use large scale forecasts to shape execution test

Brief pilots and base leadership

Mr. Chris Higgins responsibilities

Take products from the forecast funnel and tailor them to 2-3 star generals who are responsible for the air war

Forecast planning was for the long range

Situational awareness for the top brass

How will weather impact and shape the battle space presently and into the future Knowledge of weather limitations

Know and understand the impact of weather on ground operations and close-air support availability

Needed to know all Arabian weather, European, and U.S. for the top brass For weather all over the world had implications on global military operations

Weather Support Team

Monitor and SUGGEST different things concerning meteorology to forecasters Extensive coordination's between 28th OWS, CWF's, and other field weather troops

Full mix of briefings 24/7

Formal stand-up, intranet/multi-media, walk-up, over the phone

Other tasks

Providing support for time sensitive targets and high value individuals; personal recovery; drop zone/landing zone

Challenges

Iraq – Thunderstorms, Shamal winds, dust, and Haboobs from virga showers

Afghanistan – Thunderstorms along the PAK border, dust storms, and several unusual dust events

Weather

Mediterranean High with High over northern Iran combined to produce a lee-trogh through Iraq for which a meandering low traversed upon ... thus providing northwest flow all season long

For Afghanistan, weak cold air advection through the narrow mountain chain passes across the north would allow for the acceleration of winds and blow across the dry lake beds resulting in large dust storms

HaBoobs ... thunderstorm outflows resulting in cool air kicking up dust
